ABOUT THE MACE

The ceremonial mace is an ornately decorated staff made of metal and wood, traditionally carried before a sovereign or other high official in civic ceremonies by a mace-bearer. Maces are commonly featured in processions at parliamentary events and formal academic occasions. Over time, the design of modern ceremonial maces, like those used by university chancellors, has evolved from their original form as formidable weapons to more decorative items often resembling large pepper grinders used by restaurant staff.

Mr. Ronald Warren, former social studies teacher (1960-1990), designed and fashioned our mace. There are three sides at the top representing the three major components of education at Loyalsock Township High School: academics, music and the arts, and sports and activities. The finial is a hand-carved Lancer.

ABOUT THE COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

We are honored to welcome Steve Lloyd, Class of 1986, as this year's Commencement Speaker. Mr. Lloyd is a respected broadcaster and longtime advocate for student-athletes throughout Northeastern Pennsylvania, known for his dedication to telling the stories of local schools, teams, and communities.

In 2025, he was inducted into the Northeast Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame in recognition of his outstanding contributions to sports journalism.

Beyond his professional achievements, Mr. Lloyd is a devoted husband, father, and mentor whose work continues to inspire students, athletes, and aspiring broadcasters alike. His journey reflects a commitment to excellence, hard work, and the power of storytelling.

ACADEMIC DRESS & REGALIA

Our academic procession includes members of the faculty of Loyalsock Township High School, Loyalsock Township Middle School, and Schick Elementary School. Our faculty wears academic dress and regalia. The following concerning the tradition of academic dress is provided for your information.

American academic dress has its origins in the garments worn at medieval British universities, particularly Oxford. That university was founded in the Twelfth Century, with its early chancellors being representatives of the bishop. Because of the close connection between the University and the Church, students and faculty wore clerical garb. It is from these medieval cassock-like garments that American academic dress is derived.

The Oxford or "Mortarboard" cap came into use during the Sixteenth Century, but authorities differ on its origin. Some say that the cap is square like a scholar's books; others that it was derived from the master workman's mortarboard; still others suggest that it was patterned after the quadrangular shape of the Oxford campus. The distinguishing feature of the cap is the color of the tassel, which is usually black for the holders of the bachelor's and master's degrees and which may be gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

Although caps and gowns had been used in many American schools since Colonial times, it was not until about 1855 that there was a widespread student movement for their use at commencement ceremonies. The faculties were quick to approve this practical and dignified graduation dress, and soon adopted for themselves the custom of wearing gowns at academic ceremonies. By 1895, the Intercollegiate Commission had prepared a code for academic costume which was approved by 95 percent of the American universities and colleges, and is followed today by many high schools.

The code provides for three types of gowns. Those worn by the bachelors are black and have long pointed sleeves. Masters may wear either black silk or woolen gowns made with a long, closed sleeve with an arc appearing near the bottom and a slit for the arm. The doctor's gowns are usually of black silk with full, round, open sleeves. The color of the velvet trim may be black or the same color as the velvet which edges the hood. Although the color is normally black, several institutions have authorized doctoral gowns in their school colors.

The hood is the most distinctive feature of academic attire. Used originally as a cowl, as a shoulder cape, and as a container in which to collect alms, it is now worn at the back, suspended near the shoulders. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. The bachelors wear a hood which is three feet long, with a two-inch velvet border. The hood for the master's degree is three and one-half feet long, with a three-inch border. The doctor's hood is four feet long and the border is five inches wide. The inner lining of the hood is in the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree, while the color of the border indicates the field of learning in which the degree was earned.
